

### ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY:

Dravidian University was established in 1997 at Kuppam through an Act of the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly on a sprawling campus of 1091 acres. Kuppam is a tri-junction for the States of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Tamilnadu. The University campus is serene, peaceful, pollution-free and aesthetically appealing. The University formally came into existence in October 1997 and began functioning with two departments in 1998, has today grown into a strong institution of 22 Academic Departments and 7 Centers.

There are certain indicators of Human development such as life expectancy, infant mortality rate, poverty, access to basic services (availability of services necessary for healthy life like sanitation, clean water etc), risk of disease, access to education, literacy rate, access to technology, male/female equality (education and employment), and government's spending priority on health and education by comparing its expenditure on military and paying of debts etc. When we look at these indicators, we lag behind. As per the United Nations Development Programme, our country's position is 135<sup>th</sup> in the human development index.

India is at highest position in the youth population in the world. In such a situation there is a need to meet human development through education, to see that the rank be improved. In meeting the index, the country has certain challenges such as cultural challenges (attitudes), technology (skills), values of behavior (changing and evolving value orientation), knowledge/information, life style/habits, knowledge of new practices (elimination of skill gap), environmental issues, illiteracy, aging population, slow rate of expansion due to labour shortage, increased educational attainments, decline of public schools etc.

Hence, there is a need to reflect upon these challenges and make a march towards the objectives of human development through education by looking at different angles of human development. Against this backdrop, a national seminar of this nature is felt the need of the hour to arrive at suitable strategies for Social Transformation and Inclusive Human Development through Education
